Confession and Absolution

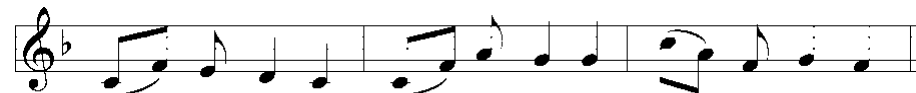
